

2025 Year-End Fundraising **Projects Overview**



Restoring Clean Water Access to Resettled Populations
Association pour le Développement Namalgbzanga du Centre
Nord

Centre Nord/Kuilsé region Funding amount: \$15,000

The project aims to sustainably rehabilitate defective hydraulic structures in Boala, capital of the Namentenga province, to guarantee equitable and secure access to drinking water for populations resettled after two years of forced displacement. The project will restore 3 wells to working order, conduct multiple community awareness sessions on hygiene and sanitation, revitalize three Water User Associations to ensure project sustainability, and provide clean drinking water to an estimated 2,500 people who have returned home.



Green Women of Ouagadougou: Agroecology & Market Gardening

Association Dignité Humaine et Développement Durable Centre/Kadiogo region Funding amount: \$15,000

This project aims to improve the economic and ecological resilience of female market gardeners in the green belt of Ouagadougou through the development of sustainable agroecological practices, access to productive resources, and strengthening capacity. Through an innovative three-pronged approach that involves the creation of a local seed bank with conserved varieties and innovative demonstration plots based on the theory of "learning by doing," 60 women will be mobilized to protect the green belt while increasing their incomes by at least 20%.







Preventing Female Cancers through Screening and Vaccination

Initiative d'Aide au Développement Local

Centre Ouest/Nando region Funding amount: \$12,000

This project aims to strengthen the prevention of female cancers through awareness campaigns, screening, and vaccination. Cervical cancer is the leading cause of cancer mortality among women in Burkina Faso. By involving community leaders, adapting messages to local languages, and bringing screening and vaccination services closer to the population (markets, neighborhoods, public places), the project removes barriers to accessing information and care, while creating a lasting change in health habits. 5,000 women will receive screening, and 10,000 girls ages 9-14 will receive the HPV vaccine.



Girls' Education and Empowerment

Sahal & Sahara Peace and Empowerment (Sahel Sage)

Sahel/Liptako region

Funding amount: \$8,000

The project aims to remove barriers to education for girls in Dori and Gorom-Gorom in the Sahel region, one of the areas that has been hardest hit by the humanitarian crisis. By providing tuition, school supplies, menstrual hygiene kits, food, year-long mentorship and tutoring, and vocational training activities, the project aims to increase school retention rates and improve academic outcomes, enabling 50 girls to reach their full potential and become empowered members of their communities.
